

## Los Angeles (area) Venue Report #10









Monday, June 2, 2008

Los Angeles SBE Chapter 47 was my very first SBE Chapter, but in this market, SBE means almost all radio. Los Angeles is the only place where there is a television organization called the Society of Television Engineers. STE was founded back in the early 40s and arguably predates all other broadcast engineering organizations anywhere. When asked for all television engineers to raise their hands, I only counted 3 out of the 32 in attendance (according to the sign in sheet); the remainder of those who were not reps were all radio folks.

Our presentation was hosted by SBE Chapter 47 at the Burbank Holiday Inn and lunch was covered by Kevin Campbell of APT North America, a developer of both audio compression algorithms and broadcast audio hardware. There was some interest in the audience about this particular technology.

Despite knowing our program is a bit longer than what my audiences have wanted (see the comments posted to date), those here in LA seemed not to mind too much. We are working on getting the presentations shortened without losing any of the key points of the technologies being presented.

It goes without saying that there was keen interest in all the audio related products from Henry Engineering's new MixSix Console to the BluTooth gear from JK Audio. I found there were some interested in the Audamate Golden Eagle HD Radio RF monitor. All interested persons departed with CDs from these companies.
