









Corpus Christi, TX Venue Report #17 Tuesday, June, 17 2008

We got there early and after checking at the front desk, we were shown to the studio where we've done the Road Show for the past few years. It has plenty of room, but the lighting wasn't the greatest. We were assisted in getting our gear into the facility and set up by several of the KZTV technical people. Early on, Tino Burrlala, an engineer from KRIS-TV 6, the NBC affiliate, was went over to KZTV (the CBS affiliate) by his chief engineer, Steve West, SBE Chapter 29's Chair to give us a hand. Tino remained to assist with packing up as well. This kind of help is very much appreciated.

The turnout was very disappointing. This is the lowest of all the venues to date. I have no idea why. The CBS (host to us), NBC and ABC affiliates were all represented. I was told that some were on vacation and others had technical issues. One never knows.

Those that were present were quite interested in all the technology we brought with us. In particular there was much discussion, many questions and interest in and about the JVC camera we had with us, the telecast fiber equipment, the Audemat ATSC and HD Radio equipment and the Nverzion automation. I was pleasantly surprised by the variety of products being demoed.

The systems displayed were a nice sampling of items addressing the various needs of many broadcasters. Although I realize that this venue is an opportunity for the smaller companies to grab an audience that may have missed them during the show and to bring their products to engineers that probably were not allowed to go to the Vegas show, I enjoyed learning more about them and I'm sure they made an impression on other engineers as well.
