









Charlotte, NC Venue Report #30 Wednesday, July 23, 2008

As we discussed the various technologies, one person said that his facility was very pleased to have an Omneon Spectrum Video Server in service and love it. Another made comments about their Axcera transmitter. Avocent's technology is also being used in this market with one person commenting that it made life more convenient and it saved time. Not to be out done, one person said they had seven Tiernan encoders and they work fine. He'd recommend them to anyone interested in an encoder.

Many of the PBS stations have multiple streams and they feed several extended areas. Interest was express here in Charlotte, as it has been in many areas, in the capabilities of the Trilithic EAS system to serve these requirements. As with all my sponsors, I do my best to answer all the questions. I have no doubt that this technology will fill those needs, but it's too bad we don't have anything more than just business cards to give to these folks. CDs, like most all of our other sponsors provide, would go a long way to help in teaching this technology to those in attendance and give the attendees something to refer back to.
