





Northeastern, NY (Albany area) Venue Report #39 Monday, August 11, 2008



The physical effort in doing one of the Taste of NAB Road Show presentations at each location amounts to about the same, once we get there and begin to do the setup etc. The return on these efforts or investment is measured in many ways, one of them being the number of local folks that show up.
