## **Chapter 122**

There was marked interest in the Trilithic EAS system. Those present were quite interested in the ability for it to be used in more than one operation at the same time as would be the case at the half dozen Clear Channel radio stations located where we were presenting. There was also interest in both the JK Audio technology as well as the technology we had with us from Henry Engineering.

As mentioned above, there was only one television engineer present and he was able to extol the virtues of his Axcera transmitter. He related a story about how, when his station drove to the Axcera factory in nearby Pennsylvania, picked up a new transmitter, returned, install it and had it on the air within 24 hours without a hitch. He said that the Axcera support would be difficult to beat.
