





Wichita, KS Venue Report #70 Monday, October 13, 2008



Presenting to the Kansas Association of Broadcasters (KAB) is a very positive experience I will long remember. The success of this event is the amalgamation of several efforts. I was contacted back in July, while still presenting the Taste of NAB Road Show to parts of the deep south, and asked if I could swap the dates I had scheduled for Tulsa, OK and Wichita, KS so that Kansas' SBE Chapter 3 in Wichita could be involved in the KAB annual convention. Seeing no reason why not, and with the cooperation of SBE Chapter 56 in Tulsa, the change was made.

Working with both Robert Nelson, Chief Engineer at Kansas State University, representing SBE Chapter 3 and Kent Cornish, President and Executive Director of the Kansas Association of Broadcasters, we were given a large ball room to set up in and were the focus of the technology being presented at this several day event. In the morning, I had a 45 minute session where I gave a thumbnail view of the technology that I had with me on the Road Show and that was at NAB this year. We had well over forty technical and other interested folk that attended that session while other sessions for sales, management and legal were going on. This was about ten percent of the registered attendees.

In the afternoon, I had the entire time from 1:30 to 5:00 PM to reprise all the various



technologies I had on display as folks came in: just like at NAB. I did have two times set aside during this time when I presented a tutorial on fiber optics and the use of the Cinezone and Cinelite features of the Leader technology. Believe me, no one got left out during this time period. I had questions on all aspects of the twenty-two technologies I had with me and each were discussed in depth with those interested. No one got left out, nor

should anyone feel slighted. All-in-all, it was truly a big success as well as an honor and privilege for me to participate in such a prestigious event and to have the help and support of so many.

Between the business cards I collected for the door prizes and the sign-in sheet, we had a total of thirty in attendance, but at one point during the presentation, I took a head count and we had over thirty-eight seated. Throughout the day, I was thanked by nearly everyone I came into contact with for the Taste of NAB Road Show participation in this event. I truly appreciate that. The hospitality is unparalleled!

Thanks VERY much for bringing the Taste of NAB Roadshow to Omaha, Ne. on Oct. 10. It allowed me to see some of the new equipment available after I missed the NAB convention in the spring. I used to think that the television equipment was not relevant to those of us in radio broadcasting, but have changed my mind. I saw equipment that would help us out with trade shows, and other events that we attend during the year, including our permanent display in a local museum. I also realize that more and more radio and newspaper websites are offering archived, local video stream coverage of many types of events. So, our news people will probably be carrying video cameras in the very near future, and that will also make video editing necessary as well. It seems that the Internet has become the "Great Equalizer" in the media. We may have radio or TV broadcasting or print as our primary outlet at this time, but as time and technology progress, the Internet will reach a greater percentage of our audience. Those that do not offer full service (video, audio, and in depth text) coverage will be left behind. Those of us in the engineering field had better be prepared for non-traditional methods and practices, or we will be the ones left behind in the dust.
