I'm sorry I had to leave the show early to teach WSU wine microbiology class at 2:10. (Yes, we do teach students to be winemakers. © With budget cuts and retirements I'm being used as a instructor until the hiring freeze comes off and we can hire more people.)

But I will definitely keep Trilithic in mind as a replacement for my station's Burk EAS which is barely alive and not well supported by Burk. That Compliance Assistant software looks very interesting after messing with cash register paper and ribbons.

BTW - the microwave food sterilization project I mentioned to you in years past has recently received FDA approval for commercial use. This is one of only four FDA approvals for new food preservation technologies in the last 20 years.

Also, my FM radio station KRLF has a pair of Racon 23 GHz microwave (video link) dishes that are no longer being used and I have not found anyone interested in them. We were using them for an eight mile STL with a pair of Sony PCMs (one way video channel) and wire modems on the audio channels to connect two Burk ARC-16s. Two years ago one dish took a big ice hit which tore it off the tower. But I was able to get the enclosure welded and reinforced and after I put the electronics back it actually still works. While we were down we replaced the dishes with an Ethernet bridge and a Barix Instreamer 100/Exstreamer 100 combo which has performed better than the dishes so we no longer need these Racons.

Do you know anyone who still has need of these old dishes? Or would these be a good donation for that CA school looking for video equipment?
